Wheels for Wendy



Wendy Armitage is quite possibly one of the most inspiring women I have ever had the pleasure of speaking to in my entire life. Local resident, Dancer, Cheerleader, Coach, Wife, Mother of two, and Businesswoman, Wendy has spent the greater part of the past eight years proving that she will not be let disability stop her from achieving her dreams.

Nearly her entire life, Wendy has danced and taught others to dance. After going to University, she discovered cheerleading and her passion for the sport was ignited. Wendy worked hard and set up the first competitive university cheerleading team in the UK. They went from strength to strength, winning multiple National Titles in the process. She coached her own team, and travelled the

world training other coaches, became an internationally accredited judge, and even went on to work with many International Cheerleading competition and event companies to help with everything from backstage to running the UK's first ever University Cheerleading Competition!

Sadly, in 2009, Wendy had to give up what she loved most when she was diagnosed with Reflex Sympathetic Dystrophy, which causes constant pain in her feet and legs, and could no longer stand well enough to continue. As her disability continued to worsen, cheerleading seemed to be all but out of reach until she spoke to a friend about ParaCheer. The ParaCheer division involves physically disabled and non-disabled athletes competing together on integrated teams, demonstrating on the world stage that disability is not a barrier to performing at the highest level in this fast-paced, acrobatic sport.

This year, Wendy has been chosen to be a part of the team representing England at the ICU World Cheerleading Championships in Orlando, Florida. Team England ParaCheer will be the first ever integrated national team of disabled and non-disabled cheerleading athletes.

For Wendy, representing England is something that "she had always dreamed of doing and never thought it was possible." "It is exciting to be a part of something new" says Wendy. With tryouts in September, the team have from mid-September until the end of April to prepare for the competition. The team trains twice a month, working in six-hour sessions, spending a large portion of their free time practising and maintaining their level of fitness. Beyond the competitions, Wendy says that the sessions themselves, although challenging at times, are "good fun, good exercise and a great way to meet lots of people. Because Wendy has never cheered in a wheelchair, adapting stunts can be tricky; she says she is "learning to use her body in different ways." There are a "huge range of disabilities on our team: missing limbs, blindness, deafness - but by the end, you forget who is disabled and who isn't. The sport is very fulfilling." However, despite all of this NHS are not able to provide her with a wheelchair, so in order to compete, Wendy has started a Crowdfunder page to ask for financial assistance from all of her supporters.

Team England are set to compete in the first ever competitive ParaCheer division at the Cheerleading World Championships in Orlando, Florida, USA in April 2017 and we wish them the best of luck!





Sir William was a composer, conductor, pianist, and music educator and was firm friends with Mendelssohn and Schumann. Barry owns a large proportion of his grandfather's music collection, from which he selected a variety of compositions to entertain us.

In early October, Sheila Roberts presented "Music of the Spheres". She began with "Also sprach Zarathustra", by Richard Strauss, followed by "Sunrise", by Grofe, and Handel's "Total Eclipse! No sun, no moon from "Samson". Next, 'Mercury the Winged Messenger' from Holst's "The Planets", 'O Silver Moon' from Dvorak's "Rusalka", "Star Dawn" by Alan Hovhannes, and 'To the Evening Star' from Wagner's "Tannhauser". These were followed by the waltz "Music of the Spheres" by J. Strauss. The "Jupiter Symphony" by Mozart,

Beethoven's "Moonlight Sonata", 'The Stars are brightly shining' from Puccini's "Tosca", Grofe's "Sunset", and finally Haydn's 'The Heavens are telling' from his "Creation" which brought an evening of heavenly music to a glorious close.

After much input from Bookham residents via both formal and informal consultations, and after four years of work by your Neighbourhood Forum, the proposed Neighbourhood Development Plan went off to Mole Valley District Council. They, in turn, went through a formal public consultation and eventually our NDP was examined by an Independent Inspector. The Inspector said that "the Plan reads well, looks well and has a very clear and sharp focus on the style, size, and type of housing required in Bookham, protecting the retail centre and the design and quality of build Bookham aspires to."

The Inspector recommended some changes,

however, he also recommended that MVDC should agree to the NDP going forward to public referendum. At the Mole Valley District Council meeting that took place on December 6th 2016, all was agreed. We are now in the final stages of this phase. If you would like to read the final NDP, please take a look at our website at

Having an approved NDP in place has two major benefits: first, it means that Mole Valley will, by law, have to adhere to the policies therein when evaluating planning applications for developments in Bookham; secondly, due to future developments in Bookham, approximately £65,000 per year will

be available to be spent specifically in Bookham as a result of the introduction of a new Community Infrastructure Levy. For more information, please visit

The Referendum will be held on May 4th, 2017, coinciding with usual Local Elections. So, please get ready to vote!

The last term and a half at Eastwick Schools has been jam-packed with activities, learning, new experiences, and events for both the children and their families! Alongside the usual exciting topics, trips, productions, assemblies, sporting events, Fireworks nights, and Christmas fairs, children at Eastwick are enjoying more choice than ever when it comes to trying out new skills and building on existing ones in after-school clubs.

The list for the infant school now includes judo, parkour, and mini yoga in addition to the preexisting football, tag rugby, gymnastics, cricket, and tennis. Also on offer is ukulele, choir, cookery, sewing, Spanish, and French. Judging from the number of excited children lining up after school, the clubs are very much in demand!

Enjoyment, exercise, and variety is the aim of the afterschool clubs, and perhaps none more so than Fun Sport on a Friday afternoon, run by Headteacher, Mrs. Kareen O'Brien, assisted by junior school students and parent volunteers.

The junior school also has an impressive number of club opportunities, such as archery,

As part of an educational initiative to encourage children to "Be the Best You Can Be", she also talked about what inspired her to get to the Olympics and how she keeps herself motivated every day. The children were fascinated by her story and realised that anything is possible if you work hard at what you love, and 'be the best you can be'!

National Trust Bookham Commons



A great deal of our work on Bookham Commons takes place around the edges: whether it's woodland margins with its interesting wildlife, car park surrounds that need to be kept tidy, or property boundaries that need inspecting for tree safety, fly-tipping or encroachments...it all needs looking after!

We've made excellent progress with the "Edge Project", our three-year plan to rescue the nightingales habitat, promoted and sponsored by the Friends of Bookham Commons and aided by the Surrey Community Foundation. This project aims to restore the wild flowers,

grassland and dense scrub that will benefit a variety of species of birds and insects, whilst providing a pleasant experience for the occasional wandering human! While this work may look destructive, please be assured that all work is undertaken very carefully on a rotational basis with the long-term survival of the wildlife at the forefront. We hope to preserve this historic landscape for future generations to enjoy and we know the results will be magnificent!

The manorial strips of common land going south into the villages of Great and Little

Bookham are undergoing some changes which will affect both for ourselves and the households that border it. These are our high-profile 'shop window' and need to be kept a little less wild than the rest of the commons. Annual wayleaves have been replaced by long-term leases and are now required to provide vehicular access to properties. However, this protected common land adds greatly to the valuation of a house. Thanks to the National Trust Act, this land cannot be built-on or used for any other purpose without the express will of Parliament.

None of this beautiful, peaceful and interesting landscape would be here without your valued and continued support, for which we are all grateful! Thank you! Surrey Wildlife Trust

Last autumn, mild weather was followed by a proper winter chill! Frost and icy grounds, and almost alternate days of thick fog or clear skies and sunshine. Norbury Park can look as stunning in its winter gray scale as it does in full summer brights!

Some of the Trust's beautiful Belted Galloway cattle, 21 altogether, grazed the various areas of SSSI chalk grassland from the end of August, until a week before Christmas. For the first time, the whole of Walnut Tree Clump grassland was grazed as one area, with huge thanks to Norbury Volunteers for their sterling work in putting up over 1000m of electric fence. Also, thank you to the public who seemed to cope well with the squeeze gaps we provided to allow them continued access in and out of the area! Much as we hope the cattle will keep the scrub down, even this hardy native breed are in fact 90% grass eaters,

so some areas have had a follow-up cut by the tractor to maintain the scrub so it does not dominate the more specialist chalk downland grasses and wildflowers.

A small amount of ride widening and coppicing has been done in the southern end of Bookham Wood, but there were no major woodland projects planned for last year aside from routine maintenance of the area. However, one of the more important tasks from this list was Tree Risk Assessments. To do this, the whole of the site was walked, assessing any trees that posed potential safety issues with particular concern for public footpaths, bridleways, and tracks. As you can imagine in Norbury, this takes a huge amount of time and diligence! We are extremely grateful to our colleague (currently on maternity leave), who has surveyed nearly all of Norbury, complete with babe (and jack

russell) in tow! If you happen to spot some trees with a small green dot on them, it does not necessarily mean that they are condemned, just that they are worthy of further assessment.

Did you know that historically there was a holly plantation in Bookham Wood? This was then harvested every December and taken up to London for people to buy around Christmas time! If you have any bits of knowledge or historical information about the park that you wish to share, please feel free to contact us! Norbury Park Volunteer Group meets every third Friday of the month, carrying out various tasks to preserve this invaluable area of Surrey countryside. National Trust Polesden Lacey

The house at Polesden Lacey has been open every day throughout January and February, with our new seasonal programme, Rules and Roller Skates: The Perks of a Life in Service. This programme explores the lives of Polesden's hardworking servants, and what they got up to in their precious spare time while their mistress, Maggie Greville, was away!

Until recently, the house was closed down over the winter weekdays to allow the rooms to rest. But for the first time, this flagship National Trust property will be open every day, whilst exciting, new rooms are slowly revealed to the public. Visitors will be able to access backstairs areas for the first time, including the servants hall and the attic bedroom, where the male servants slept. But what did Polesden's servants do to wind down? If Downton Abbey has taught us anything, it was that servants were dreadfully overworked during the early twentieth century, trudging back to their tiny bedrooms only after everyone else had retired to pre-heated beds that the staff had already prepared.

However, for Polesden's servants at least, it wasn't all drudge and duties. Rules and Roller Skates reveals that there were, in fact, many perks to living life in service at Surrey's finest



party house for a mistress at the height of Edwardian society. Creative Programming Manager, Lauren Milsom, explains "this season's programme, Rules and Roller Skates, was inspired by an amusing account by Mrs. Greville's stable groom, Arthur Thompson. Arthur revealed how during Mrs. G's absences, staff took a more relaxed approach to their duties, even roller skating up and down the north corridor near the kitchens! It's just lovely to think of the servants enjoying their home as much as their mistress would have done."

Over the years, the house team have made contact with various surviving members of the staff, or their relatives, to collect stories about their time in service. These accounts all speak of a tightknit community who worked, lived, and played together. Some even found true love, not without a little push from their notorious matchmaker, Mrs. Greville!

Mrs. Greville encouraged a strong sense of community amongst her staff, including an Annual Servants Ball, and a thriving social club. Servants from across the property would meet up to enjoy a drink, play darts and billiards, or peruse the large library, all of which Mrs. Greville had generously stocked. With the use of the 18 hole golf course, tennis courts, and a competitive cricket team (well placed in the local leagues), there was certainly a thriving social scene that the Polesden staff enjoyed in their hard earned leisure time!

If you want to know what Bookham and the wider district once looked like, what went on here and how people lived their lives, we can bring it all to life for you. As well as the Museum, our records at the Kirby Library, and stocks of our own published books (available from local booksellers), we have a full programme of monthly talks lined up throughout the year in the Abraham Dixon Hall of the Leatherhead Institute every third Friday of the month from 7:30pm.

On March 17, 2017 Society archaeologist, Nigel Bond will be talking about his work here in Surrey. Pat Jenkins, archivist of the City of London Freeman's School will be talking about Ashted Park on April 21, 2017. On May 19, 2017

This features the actual voices of local residents recalling life in the district up to a century ago. There has been a great deal on the news, and in the press about how so many feel lonely in our society. This is the main reason we started The Meeting Place in Bookham, and since then we have created many opportunities to reduce that sense of isolation and exclusion. Our Coffee Shop sessions throughout the week and on Saturdays reach out to parents with young children, the elderly, and anyone in between! We know that different groups require company at different times, so any and all are welcomed at the Coffee Shop.

We welcome all who seek help and can assist with guidance to other local support groups if necessary. Illness can lead to a real sense of exclusion from day-to-day life, both for the sufferer and their carers. From Dementia, to deafness we offer a safe place to offer care and support to those who need it most. For those

unable to speak or understand English, we now have a wonderful Language Hub, where TEFL trained teachers volunteer their services at a more reasonable rate for daytime and evening classes in Bookham. Poverty is often hidden in our area, but it is much more prevalent than we realise. We keep our price low, and if asked, we can help practically with discreet referrals to local Food Banks, BESOM for household goods, and advice sessions from Citizens Advice. Wellers Hedleys Solicitors offer free legal advice on Fridays from 10:00am until 11:00am, once every fortnight, please contact The Meeting Place to book an appointment. Hearing Champions hold sessions on Saturdays, please contact us for dates. Our AGM is on Saturday March 18th, 2017 from 12:15 followed by a soup lunch! Please let us know if you intend to come, to ensure there is enough food to go around.

The Meeting Place Cafe and Community Hub is open from 10:00am until 12:00pm Monday, Friday, and Saturday mornings at the Bookham Baptist Church. There is a soft play area for smaller children, good quality books and games for sale, with tea/coffee, cakes and biscuits available for purchase. We are proud of all we have achieved, and all we continue to achieve in creating links with other local groups. To make this possible, we need to keep bolstering our team of volunteers and Trustees, so if what we do appeals to you, please consider joining!
